Course: AR 145 Sculpture II

Credits: 3

Description

Students will build on what they have mastered in Sculpture I. Students will continue to use basic materials and specific art-historical references to create work that is more self-directed. Students will explore carving, modeling and assembling in the manipulation of materials, including paper, wood, clay, plaster and metal

At the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate and apply the fundamentals of sculpture (form, texture, negative and positive space, movement, arrangement of elements, different materials)
- Employ advanced techniques of working in three-dimensional design.
- Identify the works of specific historical styles of sculpture and artists.
- Construct a final base for each work.
- Present a body of individual sculptural forms at the end of the semester.
