### **Course: AR 215 Painting II**

**Credits:** 3

### **Prerequisites**

AR 115 Painting I

### **Description**

This course builds on what was mastered in Painting I. The development of an individualized style in form and content is explored and encouraged. Students have the opportunity to complete works that involve the figure and the environment.

### **Learning Outcomes**

At the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Apply advanced painting methods, using materials and terminology through painting a variety of subject matter in the oil media.
- Demonstrate an awareness of the history of painting. Paintings will be selected to acquaint the student with the creative uses of the oil paint media and the many different approaches in handling form and content.
- Paint in a series format.
- Demonstrate a higher degree of technical proficiency in regards to color harmonics, brushwork and working with mixed media.
- Demonstrate a deep interest and basic understanding of contemporary art issues.
- Create and analyze painting goals regarding their personal vision.
- Analyze their own work and the work of others and express constructive criticism on how to improve it.
