Course: BU 114: Business Internship

Credits: 3

Prerequisites: BU 106; BU 207; BU 115

Description:

This course introduces the student to the actual work performed in an occupational area of interest. The student will perform tasks and responsibilities at employer facilities under the guidance of the course instructor and other professionals. 90 hours of internship required.

Learning Outcomes

At the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Evaluate job responsibilities and identify the required skills, abilities, and interests needed to perform them
- Construct a set of individual goals enumerating what was accomplished during the Internship experience.
- Identify the theory and principles of business, as it applies to a specific organization
- Apply skills learned in the classroom to make a meaningful contribution to the cooperating employer.
