Course: CG 204 Graphic Design Internship

Credits: 3

Description

Graphic Design Internship is the final course in the curriculum where the students will apply the skill sets attained from the past three semesters to professional practice. The course is for graphic design majors who have demonstrated advanced skill levels and have shown the potential to perform in a work environment. The internship will allow advanced students to gain practical experience in the field by working in environments such as advertising agencies, graphic design studios, corporate in-house design departments, or on campus publication sites. Through real-world experience the students will gain additional practical skills in their interaction with designer, developers, and print production personnel.

Learning Outcomes

Successful completion of CG204 includes the following:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the graphic design field.
- Develop interviewing and presentation skills.
- Create relationships with professionals in the field.
- Prepare for and obtain on the job training to collect skill sets that will further prepare the student to work in the field of graphic design.
- Demonstrate confidence, skills and experience in team working environments, work on projects on a time based criteria, and exchange ideas with other professionals in a professional manner.
- Identify the role of graphic designer in creative process

Topical Outline

- The student will have individual meetings monthly with a faculty advisor to discuss relevant topics and concerns as relating to the individual internship placement.
