Course: CR 103 Ceramics III

Credits: 3

Prerequisites

CR 102- Ceramics II, Clay Co-op Experience – Studio is the co-requisite

Description

This course focuses on both hand building and wheel techniques to further advance his or her skills. Emphasis is placed on creating work that is not only technically accomplished, but communicates the student's personal message.

Learning Outcomes

At the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate conceptual thinking skills as applied to their ceramic pieces.
- Create advanced forms on the wheel.
- Create a body of work of hand building and/or wheel thrown items.
- Analyze their work and the work of others and make constructive criticism on how to improve it.

Topical Outline

- The student's performance will be based on the strength of their gallery exhibition (eight to ten pieces of ceramic work and a personal statement) and meeting student and instructor goals.
- Homework projects: These assignments will be reading and ceramic research projects that will relate to their work. They will be directed by the student and instructor.
