Course: CR 105 Sculptural Ceramics

Credits: 3

Prerequisites

CR 101- Ceramics I

Description

This course investigates the use of clay to create sculptural forms. Using basic building methods, students will be involved with more complex forms requiring special construction considerations. Students will use a variety of clay mixtures and mixed media.

Learning Outcomes

After the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate conceptual thinking skills as applied to their ceramic pieces.
- Recall artist who are ceramic sculptors
- Examine and be able to identify contemporary ceramics.
- Create a body of work of hand building and/or wheel thrown items.
- Analyze their work and the work of others and make constructive criticism on how to improve it.
- Present a body of ceramic sculptural work as part of their portfolio

Topical Outline

Students will be evaluated by how well they followed the directions and understood and were able to accomplish the basic issues of the assignment. The student's performance will be based on a portfolio containing the following components:

- Class projects
- These assignments will consist of ceramic projects. Tests will address ceramic concepts, technology and tools.
- Homework projects. These assignments will be reading and ceramic projects that will relate to class projects.
- Final project. Project will consist of a specific ceramic project.
