Course: CR 107 Clay Co-op Experience – Gallery

Credits: 3

Prerequisites

CR 102- Ceramics II

Description

Gives the student practical experience in operating a gallery. Students will learn all facets of gallery management, including planning and installing exhibitions and marketing and retailing in a craft environment. Students will meet with the instructor of Craft Business Practices who will organize the work schedule for the gallery. Students are expected to work four hours a week for fifteen weeks in the gallery.

Learning Outcomes

After the completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Arrange and install an art exhibit
- Communicate and foster relationships with professional artists
- Arrange artwork and design within the gallery space.
- Assist in preparing of walls and pedestals for a new exhibit.
- Identify contents and apply proper labeling and maintenance of artwork in gallery
- Review and formulate artists' contracts.
- Outline marketing and promotional procedures.

Topical Outline

Students will be evaluated on their participation in the various tasks involved with planning exhibits in the gallery during their co-op experience course. The student's performance will be based on the following:

- Planning and preparing 2 to 3 exhibits in the gallery. (100% of grade)
- Active participation in any events related to gallery exhibits such as lectures and openings by and for the gallery artists.

Assessment may be accomplished through the completion of tasks and procedures involved with the gallery exhibitions.
